**Language focus:** Ordinals/months

Level: Beginner

Time (approx.): 15 minutes

**Preparation:** Photocopy one worksheet for each student

## Using the worksheet:

→ The worksheet practices the ordinal numbers and the months of the year. It is ideal for homework.

▶ In Exercise 1 students have to re-order the letters to write months of the year.

- → In Exercise 2 students have to write numeric versions of the ordinals which are in their written form.
- → In Exercise 3 the students have to write the name of the months by again reading the written version of the ordinals.
- ▶ Lastly students use dates in a contextualized activity. They have to write the names of the people under the correct date in the calendar

### Additional ideas:

- Write 5 or 6 ordinal numbers on large pieces of paper and place them around the room.
  Write them large enough for the students to see clearly.
- ★ Explain that you are going to call out an ordinal number and they have to point to it on the wall. This is especially useful for the more difficult ordinals. Do the game quickly so that students are continually pointing at different numbers.
- → If students do this well, get them to do it in pairs. One student says a number and the other student points at it.
