Not long ago the term 'system' was hardly used, but the idea of system has got more and more important, which is reflected in the global use of the term in today's world. We are surrounded by ecosystems, we live in political and social systems, we use transport systems, etc. The word 'systems', however, is a problem word. Although everyone knows (or thinks they know) what it means, it turns out to be surprisingly difficult to define precisely. Systems are commonly defined in the dictionary as 'a group of objects linked by some form of interaction or interdependence; an organized whole such as the solar system or telegraph system'. Each society has its own beliefs, customs, behaviours, and social habits. These give people a sense of who they are, how they are supposed to behave, and what they should or should not do.

People become conscious of these rules when they meet people from different cultures. For example, the rules about when to eat vary from culture to culture. Many North Americans and Europeans organize their timetables around three mealtimes a day. In other countries, on the other hand, it's not like this – people eat when they want to, and every family has its own timetable.
